#### From the Desk of Pastor Orin :

Dear Saints,

Greetings in the name of our crucified, risen, and ascended Lord and coming Savior Jesus Christ!

In the September Spirit, I asked you to pray for our church, and consider growing your giving to sustain discipleship for ministry and mission. Following up on that ask, it is my intention in this issue of the Spirit to make the connection between **stewardship** and worship.

Often worship is overlooked when considering **stewardship** as attention is given to the church budget. We are reminded that worship begins with the Lord who comes to us in Word and Sacrament. And since **stewardship** is a response of the whole person/community to God who gives and invites us in, it is the basis of our worship. So, as stewards, we

Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name – Ps. 100:4.

In his explanation of the Third Commandment, Luther said, "We are to deem God's Word holy, and willingly hear and learn it by regarding it as God's voice speaking to us. Going to church gladly and regularly. Listening attentively and devoutly to God's Word, and joining heartily in the service...doing whatever promotes the worship and honoring of God by ourselves and by others" (Large Catechism).

Acknowledging that our God gives, and we gladly receive, it is fitting that we give back to God. Thus, we join our spiritual ancestors in an act of worship; a ritual of receiving and giving:

Ascribe to the LORD, O families of the peoples, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength.
Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; bring an offering and come into his courts.
Worship the LORD in holy splendor; tremble before him, all the earth – Psalm 96:7-9.

Worship is not limited to one day. We are to serve the Lord throughout the week, beginning on the first day of the week or more appropriately, the Lord's Day. From a place of plenty, we confidently join the baptized community assured that "my God supplies all our needs" (Phil. 4:19). So, we worship with all that we are and have in Christ Jesus—time, talents and treasures.

Finally, it is comforting to know that nothing is left to chance, but that God cares about my physical, emotional, intellectual, occupational, financial, social, environmental, and spiritual needs. Therefore, with such blessings, I live my life not to gain favor but to express my love for God, who created me to love and be loved.

Let us pray:

Lord Jesus, fill your children at Messiah with the knowledge of God's will, with all wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives. Empower them to live as you desire that they will always do what pleases God, and may their lives produce all kinds of good deeds as they grow in the knowledge of God. Amen.

### How Your Giving Dollars Are Used to Maintain the Church Property

For the past year there have been multiple projects concerning church property where funding was not directly taken from budgeted line items. For instance, the South Kings house purchase was funded with a member loan to be repaid, and the parking lot was resealed in part with a substantial endowment grant. Most purchases and maintenance are carried out with funds from the general giving of members and guests. The sources and use of those funds are presented each year in the financial report and in the upcoming yearly church budget. The funding is from pledges (line item 40000), loose collections (40130). Below is an overview of property items found in the Resource Ministries section of the budget.

The day-to-day budgeted property items of the church include regular bills such as building (56500) and vehicle insurance (56150), utilities (56210), trash pickup (56340), and janitorial services (56320), security and fire protection (56304-56307). These are funded by donations to the general fund. Normal maintenance or emergency repairs such as the building air conditioning systems, appliances, and roofing are also funded from the general giving (56400).

The Property Committee has a group of dedicated volunteers that maintain our buildings and landscaping. There are times when these projects require supplies or specialized equipment that are funded through budgeted items from general giving (56302 and 57300).

The Property Committee also keeps a reserve fund that is renewed each year by budgeted general giving. This fund has been used in the past to replace refrigerators, the oven/range, dishwashers, and garbage disposal in the kitchen (41105 and 41255).

Pastor Orin wrote in last month's Spirit about the blessings he sees in how we engage in ministry and mission to the glory of God. Please be mindful that the property of the church is maintained mostly through the normal budget as you consider your gifts for 2023.

# Technology Ministry

The Congregational Care Committee is interested in establishing a Technology Ministry. We want to ensure that everyone who is homebound, or otherwise unable to attend church in person, can seamlessly access Messiah church services and communicate with the church office on TV, smartphone, and other internet devices.

We would also hope to assist anyone who might have questions about using the full potential of his/ her phone or computer or help with the set up of a new internet or Bluetooth enabled device such as a TV, remote control, phone, computer, router, or even a new car infotainment system, doorbell, or coffeemaker.

We need to pair experts with those who would like help. If you are the parent of an expert or love playing with all the new technology yourself, please get in touch with the Messiah church office.

Also, if you need help with viewing online church services or would like to set up a new phone or device or better understand the devices you have, please get in touch with the office so that we can pair you with an expert.

### Safe Walking for Exercise

With summer ending and fall arriving, many of us are thinking about walking in the cooler and drier weather. We have all heard of the benefits of walking.

- Walking is NOT a complicated activity requiring expensive equipment
- Helps maintain a healthy body weight while losing body fat
- Can prevent or manage diabetes, high blood pressure, and heart disease
- Improve cardiovascular fitness
- Strengthen bones and muscles and improve muscle endurance
- Improve mood, cognition, memory and sleep while increasing energy level
- Improve balance and coordination
- Strengthen immune system
- Reduce stress and tension

Walking is usually safe for people of any age or level of fitness and can be adjusted to a comfortable speed. It doesn't jar joints or raise your heart rate to a dangerous level. If you are currently sedentary or have any concerns about walking, check with your health care provider. If you are comfortable with starting or improving a walking program, how do you get started?

**Find a safe place to walk–**Consider quiet streets with sidewalks, a trail in the park, athletic tracks at a nearby school, or inside a shopping mall. These are usually good choices. Consider whether sidewalks are in good repair and if lighting is adequate during early morning or sunset. If you have a fear of dogs, or strays may be a problem, carry a deterrent of some sort (Dazzer or other device used for dog training). If balance is an issue or walking surface is uneven, consider walking poles (available at sporting good stores).

**Buy a good pair of shoes-**Purchase shoes with supportive but flexible soles that cushion your feet. Shop for shoes at the end of the day when your feet are at their largest size. Choose shoes with "breathable" uppers. Most walking shoes may need to be a larger size than other shoes.

**Dress for comfort and safety-**Wear light colored clothing and a reflective vest especially if walking at dawn or dusk. Dress in layers so that you can remove an outer layer if you get too warm. If you are walking outside, don't wear earbuds because it may hinder hearing traffic or animals.

**Warm up/cool down-**Start off at a slower pace for your warm-up for the first two to three minutes. At the end of your walk, slow down for a couple of minutes to cool down even if you didn't get sweaty. Do gentle leg stretches when you finish the walk.

**Use good technique–**Walk at a steady pace after the warm-up. If you are too breathless to carry on a conversation, slow down! Hold your head up so that your chin is level and look 10-20 feet in front of you, keep your shoulders down and chest up. Let your arms swing loosely at your sides. Take comfortable strides. To go faster, take quicker steps instead of longer strides.

The faster, farther, and more frequently you walk, the greater the benefits. Start slow—even 5 minutes at lunch is a good start. After a week increase the time to 10 minutes for the next week. Build up time gradually so that when you get to 30 minutes regularly, you can begin to increase speed a bit.

- + Click on send in the upper right corner (iPhone) or the lower right corner (Android)

- + Go to a specific dated prayer request and click on "Commit to Pray."
- + You can add to a specific dated prayer request by putting the information in "Write a comment" and then clicking on "Post"
- + Each click adds one more member who prays for that person.

- + Prayer Wall Submissions will remain on the wall for one month.
- + We request that the person requesting prayer for an individual, <u>regularly</u> updates the Prayer Ministry about the condition of the individual on the Prayer Wall.
